

- IGEN's mission is to provide a platform for collaboration among all Illinois community colleges and their partners to drive the growth of the clean energy economy and green workforce.
- Our vision is to ensure that the Illinois community college system serves as a global leader in transforming the economy and education for a sustainable future.

Founded in 2008



- \$12M in funding from grants through the Illinois EPA, the Office of the Illinois Secretary of State, and the U.S. Department of Energy.
- \$9M, has been reallocated to 35 colleges for more than 160 projects related to energy and sustainability.
- IGEN received 32 project proposals and was able to issue subawards for 13 projects in the competitive evaluation process. IGEN awarded \$1,007,409 in the initial application cycle for FY24.


